

You make the call



A person may not use a bicycle to carry more persons than the bicycle is designed or equipped to carry. 551.102(b), Trans. Code

You make the Call





May not carry an Object

that prevents having at least <u>one</u> <u>hand on the handlebars</u> Sec. 551.102(c) Trans. Code

You make the Call



A person operating a bicycle shall ride only on or astride a permanent and regular seat attached to the bicycle Sec. 551.102 (a), Trans.
