



Users ...

- 149.4 million users in the U.S. had active Facebook accounts at the end of June 2011
- 51% of Americans over age 12 are on Facebook. Only 8% use Twitter.
- A survey of British employees found that 57% of staff use Twitter, Facebook or other social networking site for personal use during office hours, spending almost one working week a year on such sites.

- Policies
 - Court

- Monitoring
- Disciplinary Action
- Training, surveys, spot checks
- Communication-expectations/problems
- Outside Court Assistance

Good Rules to Follow ...

- If a post on a social media site or an email would disrupt the workplace, even if composed on the employee's own device, free time or outside the office ...don't do it!
- If your email or social media posting isn't someone you can comfortably explain to the media ... don't do it!
