

From Courtroom to Classrooms

- Each Year over <u>5,000</u> teens ages 16 to 20 die due to Fatal injuries caused car accidents.
- About <u>400,000</u> drivers age 16 to 20 will be seriously injured.
- For 16 to 19 year olds, the risk of being involved in a car accident is higher than it is for any other age group.

Municipal Traffic Safety Initiatives

Did you know:

- Young drivers between the ages of <u>15 and 20</u>, comprise <u>6.5%</u> of the licensed population
 - High number injured or killed due to speed, DUI, failure to wear a seat belt and other poor driving habits.
- Motor vehicle crashes are the leading cause of death of 15-20 year olds.
- NHTSA reported that <u>23%</u> of the young drivers between the ages of 15 and 20, who were killed in crashes, had a BAC of .08 or higher.

Mile for mile, teenagers are involved in three times as many fatal crashes as all other drivers.






















Motorcycle Safety

Motor vehicle crashes are the leading cause of death for ages 3 to 14.

Every day in the United States, an average of 4 children age 14 and younger were killed and 529 were injured in motor vehicle crashes during 2008.
