In 2010, there were 234.261 billion miles traveled on Texas roadways



By the numbers...

- 1 reportable crash every 81 seconds
- 215,593 persons injured
- 82,685 serious injuries
- 3,023 deaths

Why Municipal Courts?

- 917 courts in Texas
- 7.5 million cases
- 82.6% = traffic and parking cases
- Municipal judges make up 36% of the judiciary

ethical issues:

Canon 1

Upholding the Integrity and Independence of the Judiciary

A judge should participate in establishing, maintaining and enforcing high standards of conduct, and should personally observe those standards so that the integrity and independence of the judiciary is preserved.

ethical issues:

Canon 2

Avoiding Impropriety and the Appearance of Impropriety in <u>all</u> of the Judge's Activities

A. A judge **SHALL** comply with the law and should act at all times in a manner that promotes public confidence in the integrity and impartiality of the judiciary.

B. A judge **SHALL** not allow any relationship to influence judicial conduct or judgment. A judge shall not lend the prestige of judicial office to advance the private interests of the judge or others.

Canon 3

Performing the Duties of Judicial Office Impartially and Diligently

Judicial Duties in General.

The judicial duties of a judge take precedence over all the judge's other activities. Judicial duties include all the duties of the judge's office prescribed by law.

Canon 4

Conducting the Judge's Extra-Judicial Activities to Minimize the Risk of Conflict with Judicial Obligations

Extra-Judicial Activities in General.

A judge **SHALL** conduct all of the judge's extra-judicial activities so that they do not:

- (1) cast reasonable doubt on the judge's capacity to act impartially as a judge; or
- (2) interfere with the proper performance of judicial duties.

Canon 4

Activities to Improve the Law.

A judge **MAY** speak, write, lecture, teach and participate in extra-judicial activities concerning the law, the legal system, the administration of justice and non-legal subjects, subject to the requirements of this Code.

Teen Drivers

- 446,982 teen drivers (15-18) in Texas
- 274,300 juvenile cases
- 44% were traffic related = 120,629

Not just in the courtroom...

• 27.3% of the Texas population is under 18

= 6,865,824 teens

From Courtroom to Classroom

- For 16 to 19 year olds, the risk of being involved in a car accident is higher than it is for any other age group.
- Mile for mile, teen drivers are <u>four</u> times more likely than other drivers to crash.















How to Reach Students






Other Issues
